

Instructions

1. Glue the first page of your blank timeline onto the overlap area marked on the second page.
2. Cut out the events and arrange them (**without** sticking) where you think they go on the timeline.
3. When you are sure your events are in the right place, glue them down.



793

Vikings raid a monastery at Lindisfarne in Northumbria, North-East England

866 - 7

Danish Vikings form a 'Great Army' and invade England.
The city of York is captured, and is renamed 'Jorvik'.

954

The last Viking King of England, Eric Bloodaxe, is driven out of Jorvik.

927

Æthelstan (grandson of Alfred the Great) becomes the first King of England.

865

Vikings begin to settle in the East of England.

1066

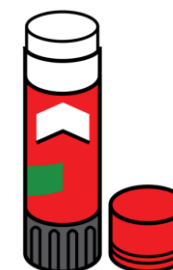
Viking leader Harald Hardrada is defeated by the English king, Harold Godwinson.

1013

Swein Forkbeard conquers London, causing the English king, Æthelred, to flee to France.

1042

Edward the Confessor (Edward II) becomes King of England.



789

The first recorded Viking attack occurs when three Viking ships arrive at Portland, Dorset.

869

Edmund, King of the East Angles, is killed by the Viking army. They behead him and throw away the head.

886

Alfred, King of Wessex makes a treaty with Guthrum, leader of the Vikings. They agree to divide England between them.

871

Ethelred, King of Wessex, and his younger brother Alfred (later Alfred the Great) defeat the Vikings at the Battle of Ashdown



843

The Kingdom of Scotland is officially formed.

806

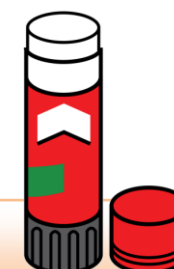
Vikings attack the Scottish island of Iona for the third time. They kill 68 monks and steal a valuable gospel book.

1066

Exhausted after defeating Harald Hardrada, Harold Godwinson is killed by William of Normandy.

1016

King Edmund dies. Swein Forkbeard's son, Cnut, becomes King of England.
